New Feature - Author Position


Allows you to analyse the position of an author (or its affiliation) listed on a document published on or after 2008. Six new indicators are available in Researcher and Organisation entities to view the document counts and the % contributions in first, last and corresponding (or reprint) author positions.

Introducing new open access data in Journal **Citation Reports**

This new open access data will increase transparency around how much of the scholarly literature is published using the gold OA model, and how much of this content is being cited. This will help the research community better understand the contribution of gold OA content to the literature and its influence on scholarly discourse.
